## Conservative 'think tanks' & special interests keep showing up

The anti-rail issue is not just a local, grassroots effort to "let the public have a voice." It is part of a national effort to maintain the status quo by ultra-conservative groups who support the automobile, bus, highway construction, urban sprawl development and petroleum industries.

It is no surprise that they do not want you to know who they really are, and who is funding their effort.

#### Many facades but few real members

Among the anti-rail leaders in Hawaii are Cliff Slater, Dale Evans (Charleys Taxi) and Panos Prevedouros (president, Hawaii Highway Users Alliance). They are all members of a conservative organization called the Grassroot Institute of Hawaii.

They and their handful of followers represent themselves variously as: StopRailNow, Hawaii Highway Users Alliance, Sensible Traffic Alternatives and Resources, Inc., The Alliance for Traffic Alternatives, Let Honolulu Vote, Honolulu Traffic.com, ZeroShibai.com, TheRailScam.com and now DraftPanos.com

Far from representing thousands of people from many diverse groups, all the organizations listed above are the creation of four people using smoke and mirrors.

This is the same pattern of rail opposition that has occurred across the county, fueled by the same collection of special interest groups.

## Mainland conservatives intrude on local debate.

Former Miss Texas Jamie Story has just moved to Hawaii and taken a job as president of the Grassroot Institute of Hawaii. She was previously a staffer with the Texas Public Policy Foundation (TPPF). TPPF has been described as a "self styled think tank with a far-right extremist agenda," and "highly biased crusaders for roadways and road-based transportation." (Light Rail Progress, August 2000)

TPPF hired a self-styled consultant, Wendell Cox, who lists among his accomplishments the defeat of rail projects in Seattle, St. Louis, Salt Lake City, Denver and San Antonio. The American Highway User's Alliance, a who's who of the trucking, auto, cement and asphalt, heavy construction and petroleum industries, has also had Wendell Cox on the payroll. The arguments used by anti-railers in Honolulu are the same ones used across the country wherever the pro-highway lobby tries to stop public transit projects.

Then San Antonio Mayor Nelson Wolff described the campaign of TPPF and Cox that killed rail there as comprised of "distortions and half truths." (Dallas Observer, 7/20/2000)

Cox is already writing letters to the editor in support of Honolulu's antirail effort. (Honolulu Advertiser, June 2, 2008)

# Anti-railers say they want voters to have a choice, but the petition offers NO choices.
